If the uniform policy is not followed parents will be contacted immediately by the class teacher or a member of senior management.

If children come to school in trainers they will be asked to change into their PE pumps straight away.

If children do not have their PE or swimming kits they will be given a spare school kit to wear (children will not be allowed to borrow kits from other pupils or siblings). If parents do not want children to borrow a kit a letter must be sent into school.

Parents will be contacted by the teacher regarding missing kits. PE and swimming is a statutory requirement and therefore all children must participate.

Boys

- Grey trousers or shorts
- Pale Blue Shirt
- Pale blue Polo Shirt
- Navy blue sweat shirt or V-neck jumper
- School fleece
- Black or grey socks
- Black shoes

Girls

- Grey skirt, pinafore dress or trousers.
- Navy blue sweat shirt, cardigan or school fleece.
- Pale blue polo shirt
- Pale blue shirt or blouse
- Summer: blue gingham dress
- White/grey socks
- Grey tights
- Black shoes (no boots)

P.E. and swimming

- Plain T-shirt in the house colour
- Pair of black shorts
- Pair of black pumps

KS2 pupils can bring an alternative pair of trainers that are more suitable for running or field activities however these need to be in a plain colour.

For swimming:

- a one piece costume for the girls
- swimming trunks for the boys (not shorts)
- swimming hat (A Grove Vale hat can purchased from the school office or a plain hat from a sports shop)

If a pupil wears a religious band or bangle, this should either be taken off for PE or swimming day or covered by a plain sweat band.

Earrings:

If children have their ears pierced earrings must be a small plain stud, no hoops, in order to comply with health and safety regulations. Earrings must be taken out by the children before they participate in PE or swimming, if they are too young to do this themselves earrings must be taken out by parents before coming to school.

Hair, jewellery and makeup:

No jewellery, make up or nail varnish should be worn, except watches; with the exception of religious bangles and charity bands. *School staff will accept no responsibility for the safe keeping of watches or jewellery.*

We do not encourage excesses of fashion and ask parents to ensure all haircuts are sensible for example, no mohicans, tramlines or shaved patterns. Hair should be neat and tidy and worn with no extremes of style or colour or beaded. Any hair accessories such as clips, slides or headbands should be minimalistic.
